

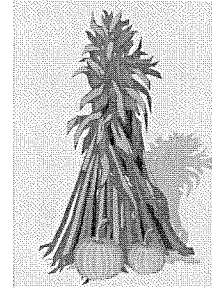


It is hard to believe that November is here and the first quarter is behind us. I hope that you are enjoying the start to the new school year as much as I am. With the new year in full swing here are a couple of reminders; if your child is absent please call the appropriate secretary and let her know. Also, the entire Superior Central Campus is tobacco free 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.


You may have seen in the news that school anti-bullying legislation is still being discussed on the state level. It seems that the legislators are having some issues with the language surrounding bullying. Although there is still no clear legislation from the state, Superior Central will strive to continue to provide an educational environment that ensures students are free from threat, intimidation, and harassment. At the beginning of the school year, Charlie Yeager from the Marquette-Alger Regional Educational Service Agency led a teacher in-service on the Michigan Model for Health. The Michigan Model contains an anti-bullying curriculum that teachers can use which includes activities and lessons to teach students skills on how to handle bullying situations. I also had the opportunity to attend an anti-bullying workshop this fall and hope to bring in more resources to assist in bullying prevention.

 The beginning of the year has brought success on the athletic front. The Varsity Girls Cross Country team was the Division III Upper Peninsula runner-up. Lauren Spranger brought home her 3rd individual Division III title with a time of 20:26. Ali Rittenger finished in 6th place with a time of 22:07. Monica Berggren and Selena Walters crossed the line in 16th and 17th places with times of 23:01 and 23:06. Teslyn Tyner finished 19th at 23:20. Vanessa Freberg and Brooke Krysiak took 35th and 36th places with times of 25:00 and 24:04.

Over on the boys side, with only two runners our Cougars were unable to fill a team for the finals. However, individually, Skyler Lloyd and Jacques Charlebois finished in the top 10. Lloyd finished in 3rd place with a time of 18:40 while Charlebois came in 7th at 19:04. Congratulations to all of those who participated in Cross Country this season!

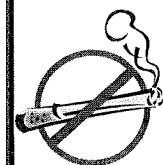
 The second year Superior Central 8-man football team finished the season with a 9-2 record. You can read more about their season in Coach Messano's article found later in this newsletter.

A big congratulations goes out to the Junior Varsity Volleyball team. The girls finished the season with a 13-1 record and were conference champions!

Change in Tobacco Policy.



At its September board meeting, the Superior Central School Board approved a policy change that "prohibits the use of tobacco on school grounds at any school sponsored event", including sporting events. This policy is being updated in response to Public Act 188 – 2009 which expanded prohibitions regarding the use of tobacco product in public places.



Educational Development Plans (EDPs) - The Basics

Introduction to Michigan's six career pathways and career planning is required in 7th grade. Then all 8th grade students will complete an EDP and revise it each year until graduation. Information about how to choose a career, what kind of training, education etc. and where to get it, is included in this process. Parents are encouraged to talk to their students about their future plans.

8th grade parents-Your students have beginning information about the six pathways will be completing their first EDP next month. They will be asked to choose two pathways that interest them and three careers, as well as what training/level of education they plan to use to prepare for the careers of interest. They will also be asked to list some colleges, technical schools, military etc. where they will get the training and what they plan to do while in high school to prepare for that training/education. You will be asked to sign the EDP showing that you are aware of the plans.

Sophomores have recently taken the PLAN test which is designed by the ACT (College entrance exam) company. The PLAN predicts ACT scores and has a career interest component that gives access to a website for further exploration. The students will use this information to update their EDPs and determine what they can do to improve their ACT scores. The PLAN is a series of timed tests modeling ACT. In Michigan juniors are required to take the ACT as part of the Michigan Merit Exam (MME) given in March of the junior year.

Juniors recently took the ASVAB test. This is a career exploration program offered by the US Military. It is a wide ranging battery of tests and interest survey that includes access to a website that provides further information, based on their test scores and input, about careers and education in general. The results also include a score that is used for entrance into all military branches should the student decide to follow that route. Juniors will use this career exploration program to update their EDPs. This test is also timed and gives students an opportunity to experience another timed test before they take the MME/ACT on March 6, 7 8, 2012. Please plan to have the juniors in school on these days.

All students, and parents/guardians need to be aware of the graduation requirements so they can plan accordingly. All this information and more local specifics are available in the handbook and on the school website www.superiorcentralschools.org under the Parent tab in the Guidance section. 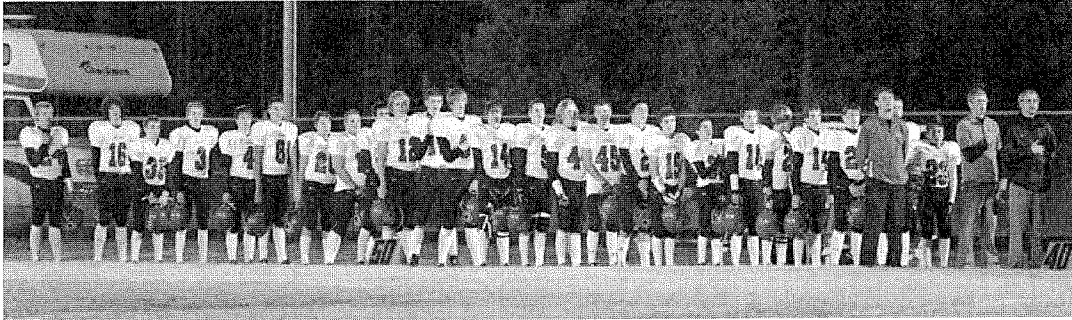


2011 Football Season

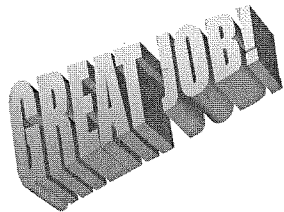

Superior Central Schools Timber Sale

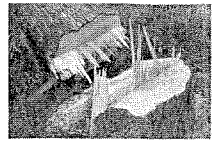

The Superior Central School board approved a sale of timber on their Limestone property to Heidtman Logging for \$64,272, the highest of three bids. The sale was organized by Gary Bucklin, forester from the Alger County Soil Conservation District and they will also supervise the harvest which will occur sometime in 2012.

The majority of the sale will go into the general fund. However, adequate funds will be set aside to replant the pine plantation and make other improvements on the Limestone school property. In addition, a small amount of funds will also be used to foster more educational activities on the timber, farm, and wild land that surround the Superior Central School in Eben Junction.

This sale came as a result of the Buildings & Grounds Committee's review of the school's land resources. The committee determined that the land resources should first be used for educational purposes and if this isn't practical, the resource will be used to generate income for the district. This sale fit our second criteria.

Superior Central School is greatly appreciative to Heidtman Logging for their generous support and Gary Bucklin and the Alger County Soil Conservation District for their excellent assistance.



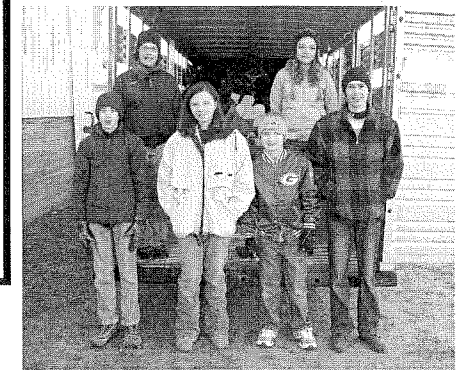
The Superior Corners 4-H Club and the Superior Central National Honor Society held a Recycling Day October 22nd at the State Farm in Chatham. Community members were invited to drop off their recyclable materials where it was packed into trailers and taken to recycling facilities. Thank you to all who participated!

The next collection day will be in April and community members are encouraged to begin saving their recyclables now. Since the program began 9 years ago, it is estimated that more than 35 tons of materials have been saved from entering the landfill. Please help us continue this great program by saving your recyclables following these guidelines:

- Newspapers, Magazines and Office Paper - pack in paper or plastic bags, boxes or bind with twine.
- Corrugated Cardboard - bind with twine or pack in a larger box (no cereal boxes)
- #1 and #2 Plastics - clean, caps removed (caps are not recyclable) and sorted, each type in a separate bag or box.
- Tin and Aluminum Cans—clean and sorted, each type in a separate bag or box.

There will be a reminder in April's newsletter to inform families of the date and time of the drop off.

CONSTRUCTION TRADES PROGRAM

The students in the Construction Trades Program here at Superior Central School are busy working on various projects. One of the larger projects is a 12 ft. by 16 ft. gambrel style shed with approximately 7ft. sidewalls. During the process of building this shed the students are learning how to layout floor joists, wall studs, and trusses at the proper spacing and to "square" decks and wall sections before applying the sheathing. After constructing the shed in the shop, students will dis-assemble the roof, wall, and floor sections and load them onto a flat-bed trailer and reassemble them onsite in Deerton. We want to thank the Deerton Fire Department for allowing the students to take on this job for them and thereby giving the students the opportunity to gain some real-world and hands-on experience.

Last week students poured the concrete in the small garage next to the school. Prior to actually pouring the concrete the students learned the basics of setting up a builder's level and a transit level and then used the transit to help create lines within the perimeter of the garage that would be used to screed to when pouring the concrete. During the process of pouring the concrete students learned how to use the concrete rakes and the aluminum screed and most importantly they learned how to work together to do a job. Because of the weather and the slow drying time of the concrete it was 8:30 at night before the job was completed. Three of the students graciously volunteered to help during this time after school to complete the job and all three of them were able to use a power trowel for finishing concrete. All in all, the students did a great job.



Other projects that are being worked on within the shop are a duck boat being built by Tyler Tyner and Colton Kennedy, an ice shanty being built by Bill Torongo and Britton Tyner, and a deer blind being built by Jacob Webber and the help of some other students. In his spare time, Trevor Chaperon has cut out, engraved, and painted a couple of "Ice Cave" signs for the county who had called the school asking if the our

The 2011-2012 teams are off to a great start. We have many hard working, responsible, fun returning students and a lot of exciting new students.

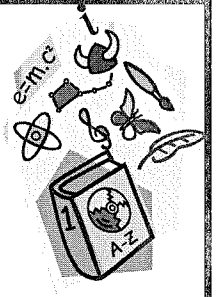
Keep the following information in mind:

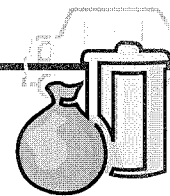

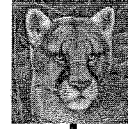

- Present your own concerns and information. Anonymous letters and / or people speaking for others are difficult to follow-up or respond to and are much easier to dismiss.
- Prior to making any public comment about school staff, please follow the proper chain of command in dealing with your concern:
 1. Direct communication with the staff member concerned.
 2. If not resolved, then bring it to the Supt/principal or Athletic Director, whomever is the staff's direct supervisor.
 3. If still not resolved, then bring to the Board in writing.

We need your ideas, passions and energy to grow our school into the best place it can be. Please help us make our meeting a forum to share and work together. Thank you in advance!
